ABOUT TF LEARN @NTU

The Temasek Foundation Leadership Enrichment and Regional Networking Programme @ Nanyang Technological University, Singapore (TF LEaRN @NTU) is funded by Temasek Foundation. The goal of the TF LEaRN @NTU scholarship programme is to nurture global-savvy future ready Asian citizens, building bridges among student leaders in Asia, with an aim to achieve the following:

- 1. Form a sustained network amongst regional LEaRN participants and build regional connection for the development of Asia.
- 2. Work together in a culturally diverse, multi-disciplinary team on a real-world SDG related project.
- 3. Acquire skillsets in cross-cultural intelligence, entrepreneurship, design/ systems thinking and social innovation whilst involved in the immersion programme.
- 4. Develop a global mindset by acquiring a better appreciation of another culture, lifestyle, language, and enriching their leadership skills.

TF LEaRN @NTU serves to provide a global learning experience for talented ASEAN undergraduates with good academic standing and leadership potential to participate and learn alongside NTU students in a short-term multi-location (Singapore and another ASEAN city) programme. Selected participants of TF LEaRN @NTU will develop a strong sense of cross-cultural intelligence and gain a global mindset with sustained network of friends for regional networking among the development of Asia. They will also develop 21st Century competencies that will prepare them to be successful in their chosen profession.

30 selected ASEAN undergraduate students will be offered this opportunity with NTU with tuition and living expenses covered.

The TF LEaRN @NTU Programme will be held from 28 June to 29 July 2023.

ABOUT NTU SINGAPORE

REQUIREMENTS

1. TF LEaRN @NTU Programme

A comprehensive summer programme over 4.5 weeks has been specially curated to build and enhance key skillsets that are important for students to be Future Ready. ASEAN youths shall first travel to Singapore to meet up with NTU students for cultural and academic immersion. Here at NTU, they will take an Entrepreneurship course, attend workshops and lectures covering design/ systems thinking and intercultural competences and then apply the learnings to solve an SDG issue within a multicultural and interdisciplinary team.

For the second segment of their learning, they will participate in a field trip to an ASEAN city and gain a deeper appreciation about Singapore and the selected ASEAN host country. This will cultivate a better understanding and sensitivity to diverse cultures and perspectives. In 2023, this segment of the programme will be held in Bangkok, Thailand, hosted by Mahidol University.

LEaRN scholars will earn 3 NTU academic units upon completion of the programme.

2. Coursework on 'Professional Development and Occupational Success' Pillar

At NTU, the LEaRN scholars will gain a fundamental understanding of the entrepreneurial process, of how entrepreneurs start and implement their business ideas and this will instill in them an entrepreneurial mindset posture for the future. They will attend workshops and lectures covering design/ systems thinking and intercultural competences and then apply the learnings to work on an SDG-related project and build a business model. They will then pitch the business solution to their peers and the academics.

3. Experiential Learning on 'Role and Impact of Asia in the World (Singapore's Perspective) and Intercultural Competence' Pillar

The programme will culminate in a 2-week immersive experience in Bangkok, Thailand where LEaRN scholars continue their learning on entrepreneurship to build industry-relevant knowledge that will allow them to expand their business (see Point 2) into the Thai market as well as gain an overview of the economic and social landscape of Thailand and regional networks. They will also deepen their appreciation and empathy towards cross-cultural differences and similarities in a multitude of ASEAN backgrounds. The LEaRN scholars will also learn about the Thai culture and participate in excursions to important heritage sites and visits to leading companies in the region. The group work on a global SDG project to solve real world issue within a multi-cultural and multi-disciplinary team shall enhance their intercultural communication and coordination skills.

4. TF LEaRN Joint Event

LEaRN scholars are required to participate in the TF LEaRN Joint Event organised by SMU with the aim to provide a networking platform for all LEaRN 2023 scholars from NTU, NUS and SMU.

5. TF LEaRN @NTU Events & Activities

LEaRN scholars are required to participate in <u>ALL</u> activities organised during the programme.

6. Reflections and Journal Reports

LEaRN scholars are required to periodically write down their reflections as well as to produce a journal, with photos, of **1,500 - 2,000 words** at the end of the TF LEaRN @NTU programme on their immersion in Singapore and the selected ASEAN host country, including coursework learning and project work on their chosen SDG topic.

7. TF LEaRN Sharing Sessions

After the TF LEaRN @NTU Programme, LEaRN scholars must be prepared to:

- share their LEaRN experiences through seminars, blogs, university websites, presentations at their home university and country,
- · stay in touch with their fellow LEaRN scholars,
- periodically complete online surveys regarding their progress and development.



ACCOMMODATION & AIRPORT RECEPTION

Accommodation On-campus accommodation is <u>guaranteed</u> for all awarded LEaRN scholars. You do not need to apply for on-campus accommodation separately through the Office of Housing & Auxiliary Services (OHAS) website. Those are meant only for FULL-TIME students, and not LEaRN scholars. NTU has 24 Halls of Residence that are home to some 14,200 undergraduates. They offer hostel styled accommodation and are co-ed by floor or wing. LEaRN scholars will be allocated randomly to rooms in an NTU undergraduate Hall of Residence based on double occupancy (twin-sharing). Request for specific room-mates or preferred Halls is not allowed. More information on NTU Halls of Residence is available here. Note: Students with a medical condition and/or have specific requests will have to submit doctor's letter certifying the condition, which will then be verified by the NTU Medical Centre. Students are required to declare their medical condition and any related request when submitting their applications for TF LEaRN @NTU. Getting to NTU There is no airport reception. INSURANCE

NTU Student Insurance Schemes	LEaRN scholars are covered under the NTU student insurance schemes while they are in Singapore, namely Group Personal Accident Insurance (GPAI), Group Hospitalisation & Surgical Insurance (GHSI) and Medical scheme, even if students have already bought similar insurance in their home country. Falling ill and being hospitalised in Singapore can be a financial drain on international students, who are not entitled to the medical subsidies that Singapore citizens enjoy. Besides the coverage it provides, the GHSI (subject to its terms and conditions) allows you to request a Letter of Guarantee from the underwriter and present it in lieu of the requisite deposit upon admission to government/ restructured hospitals in Singapore. Personal Insurance	With the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, please ensure you have sufficient and comprehensive insurance coverage, including for COVID-19 treatment, for the duration of your trip (to Singapore till you return to your home country). The NTU student insurance schemes cover only your time in Singapore. You will <u>need</u> to purchase additional insurance for your stay in Thailand.

	 Yellow Fever Requirements Students coming from or who have passed through any country at risk of yellow fever six (6) days prior to arriving in Singapore, are required to have valid certificates of vaccination for yellow fever.
	2. COVID-19 Requirements Students must produce proof of vaccination according to the WHO-EUL vaccine dosage.

Entry Requirements	LEaRN scholars are exempted from requiring a Student's Pass and may use a Short- Term Visit Pass issued at a Singapore Checkpoint for a short-term stay in Singapore to attend the TF LEaRN @NTU programme.
	You are not allowed to engage in employment activities during the immersion period.
SG Arrival Card	Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, additional entry requirements have been implemented by the Singapore government.
	Submission of SG Arrival Card (SGAC) with Electronic Health Declaration:
