Visa requirements	Students need to obtain the D-2 Visa with the admission and the invitation letter which will be issued by KIT.			
Insurance requirements	We request Health Insurance for exchange students during staying in Korea. Students can purchase health insurance from their home countries, or they can purchase it through the International Office at KIT.			
Health Check-up	All students have been requested to submit TB Test result on orientation day. If you don't, you can go to the health center in Gumi with other international students and IO staff.			
Orientation	All international students are required to attend the orientation. During the orientation, important information such as academic schedule, alien registration, health insurance and tips for living in Korea will be introduced for students to prepare the stay in Korea.

Meals and Food	Students can buy various types of meals on and off-campus, and also cook some instant snacks in the shared kitchen of the dormitory. Students usually use the kitchen to cook noodles, toast, and small snacks or to keep their own food in the communal refrigerator. Normal meal prices range from 6,000 won to 10,000 won (approx. US\$ 6~10) per meal.			
Opening a bank account	If students would like to open a bank account in Korea, they will need to bring an Alien Registration Card and a passport with them to the bank.			
Voluntary Activity	<ul> <li>One foreign student and one Korean student make a team</li> <li>Foreign students may prepare a lecture regarding one's own country's culture, language and any possible stories of home country to school kids (elementary school, middle schools or high schools located in Gumi and Gyeongbuk).</li> <li>Lecture can be 60 to 90 mins. You may teach at least one time for a month.</li> <li>Each student will get paid an allowance as a reward.</li> <li>Students will receive a certificate for volunteering at the end of semester.</li> <li>→ The program can be changed in terms of COVID-19</li> </ul>
